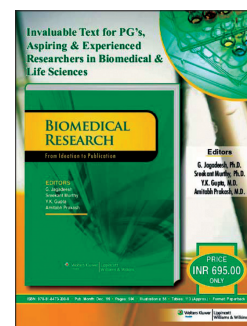


Biomedical Research – From Ideation to Publication
